Guy Edwards and John Millar lost on Devil's Thumb

With tremendous sadness and some uncertainty, the mountain community is mourning the loss of Guy Edwards and John Millar who have not been seen since April 14. Guy and John were attempting a new route on the north face of the Devil's Thumb, a challenging and remote peak in the Alaska panhandle. When they failed to return to basecamp as scheduled, a third person in their party, Kai Hirvornen, skied out for help. Air searches were immediately carried out without success. No one knows for sure what happened, but avalanche and/or serac fall are both suspected. Guy and John, both graduates of UBC and the Varsity Outdoor Club, were very strong and accomplished mountaineers. Guy leapt into the public eye in 2001 when he and several friends accomplished the first complete ski traverse of the BC Coast Mountains from Vancouver to Skagway, Alaska. John's energy and skill are celebrated in the so-named 'Millar's High Life Traverse', a 22 km long technical high altitude ridge traverse between Mt. Wood and Mt. Steele in the St. Elias Mountains. John and several friends completed the first traverse of this ridge in 1998. The two men will be remembered by many friends and climbing companions. The Executive of the Vancouver Section sends sincere condolences to their family.

Invitation To The ACC Vancouver Section - Calgary Section Summer Camp in the Freshfield Group

Vancouver Section members are invited to join the Calgary Section Summer Camp in the Freshfields. The camp is self-guided, self-catered, and self-managed so participants should have the requisite skills and be prepared to contribute in every way to ensure a successful and safe camp. In particular, all participants are expected to act as trip or rope leaders. Participants will walk in to basecamp, located at 7500' just north of the Campbell Icefield, west of Mt. Freshfield (10,945 ft.). Gear will be flown in by helicopter. This remote group is seldom visited and rarely approached from the west. Basecamp will provide close access to Mt. Freshfield while Mount Barnard (10,955'), the tallest of the group, is about 5 km south of the camp. Four more peaks on the Divide (Pilkington, Prior, Walker, Bulyea) will be accessible to the south and two (Dent, Pangman) to the north. There are variety of objectives from scrambles to some first ascent possibilities, eg, the SW. ridges of Mt. Barnard and Mt Freshfield.

Invitation to The ACC Vancouver Section - A Coastal Canoe Trip

This August, eight ACCers are invited to join ACC member Chris Cooper on his canoe expedition from Burnett Bay to Port McNeill, BC. Travel will be by Montreal canoe (the traditional Canadian eastern canoe), which accommodates 10 people comfortably. Itinerary: From Port Hardy on Vancouver Island, water taxi out to Burnett Bay on the mainland coast. Spend two to three days at Burnett Bay then travel by 37 foot Montreal canoe down the coast (Queen Charlotte Strait) to Port McNeill via Shelter Bay, Raynor Group, Fife Sound, Insect Island, Gilford Island, Village Island, Mound Island, Hanson Island, and Alert Bay. Arrive Port McNeill.

Dates: August 1 to 12/14, 2003 (10-12 days

plus two extra days for poor weather)

Cost: \$500.00 plus GST; \$100 deposit will hold your spot.

The fee includes: Montreal canoe rental, water taxi services, group canoe equipment, emergency gear, charts, VHF, and cell phone. Participants will need to arrange for their own food and transport to and from Port Hardy. Chris will send out a detailed itinerary and list of gear to bring. ACC to run Kokanee Glacier Cabin

The Alpine Club of Canada has been awarded a contract by BC Parks to operate the new Kokanee Glacier Cabin, as well as the Woodbury and Silverspray Cabins and the Kaslo Lake campground in Kokanee Glacier Provincial Park, north of Nelson, B.C. Operation will begin in June, 2003. The stunning new Kokanee Glacier Cabin is located to best take advantage of the endless backcountry hiking and skiing terrain. Visitors will enjoy an experience they will not forget!

The Kokanee Glacier Cabin was built as a result of campaign efforts carried out in memory of Michel Trudeau and the many other Canadians who have lost their lives enjoying Canada's backcountry. The national Kokanee Glacier Alpine Campaign, spearheaded by BC Parks in 2000, with the support of the Friends of West Kootenay Parks and the family of former Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau raised over \$900,000. The funding was used to build the new alpine hut, to raise national awareness about backcountry safety, and to restore the historic Slocan Chief Cabin in Kokanee Glacier Provincial Park as a backcountry interpretive centre. In addition, \$40,000 was donated to the Canadian Avalanche Association to help maintain the Public Avalanche Bulletin and ensure it is regularly updated.

GRADING GUIDELINES

- A - Less than 6 hrs travel/day
(not strenuous)
- B - 6 to 8 hrs travel/day
(moderately strenuous)
- C - 8 to 12 hrs travel/day
(strenuous)
- D - More than 12 hrs travel/day
(extremely strenuous)
- S- Slower-paced trip,
(suitable for seniors)

- 1 - Gentle slopes. Travel on trails over fairly level terrain.
- 2 - Moderate slopes. Travel may be off trail. Intermediate skiing ability recommended. Easy climbing.
- 3 - Travel in mountainous terrain. Steep forest and glaciers probable. Backcountry equipment and intermediate skiing experience required. Moderate climbing.
- 4 - Travel over difficult mountain terrain. Advanced backcountry and mountaineering experience, ability and equipment required. Advanced ski mountaineering or moderate to difficult ice or mixed climbing. Ropes and belays required.
- 5 - Technical ice or mixed climbing. Advanced climbing experience required.

Please contact trip organizers by the Wednesday prior to the trip or earlier to express your interest. Non-members are welcome to participate once or twice before joining, and are accepted on a space available basis. Everyone is welcome to attend our meetings at 7:30pm in the Floral Hall of Van Dusen Botanical Gardens, W. 37th Ave. & Oak St in Vancouver on the fourth Tuesday of every month (except July, Aug, Dec).

Trip organizers are required to have participants sign the ACC waiver which can be obtained from the climbing schedule organizer, or from: www.alpineclubofcanada.ca/vancouver.
